

PARK RULES

- Alcoholic beverages are prohibited in City Parks by Ordinance No 9-9-410
- **Parking/Vehicular Access:** Motorized vehicles of all types including golf carts, gators, ATVs, etc, are strictly prohibited on park property, lawns, turf, restricted roadway, bicycle/pedestrian pathways, canal, creek pathways, turf trail or athletic fields. All cars must be parked in designated parking areas.
- Trash and debris must be disposed of properly and area must be clean.
- **Open fires/charcoal grills are prohibited.** Make every effort to see that propane grills are placed on hard surfaces such as a sidewalk or parking lot. If this is not possible, place a barrier, such as plywood, between the grass and the generator or grill to collect spillage of fuel or grease.
- It is unlawful for any person to injure, deface, destroy, sever or remove any park property.
- If you are using amplified equipment for your picnic or event, you will need to obtain a noise permit through the Police Department per Ordinances No. 9-8-101 through 9-8-109. Please contact CSPD at (719) 444-7704 regarding noise permits. No permit is confirmed until the noise permit has been approved.
- The posting of signs leading to a reservation area or hanging decorations or other materials on park buildings, structures or vegetation is prohibited.
- Organizers of Picnics and Special Events held at Antlers Park are responsible for monitoring the parking lots across the street from the park to make sure that their attendees are not parking in the business parking lots.

City Policies

Leash Ordinance (6.7.107, 9.9.302)

City code requires all dogs be on a leash while in city parks and on city trails. For designated off-leash dog parks or dog runs, visit coloradosprings.gov/DogParks

No Smoking Ordinance (6.6.202, 6.6.203 and 6.6.204)

It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke, light, or carry any lighted smoking instrument in or on any park property.

Closing of Parks Ordinance (4.2.103)

The City can close any park to protect the park land, park property/facility or to protect the public health, safety or welfare. Should park closure happen, permit holders will be contacted immediately.

WEDDING INFORMATION

All park rules apply; to include all alcoholic beverages being prohibited by Ordinance No 9-9-410

American Mothers Chapel

The American Mothers' Chapel is located on Park property at the intersection of 31st Street and Chambers Way.

- Ceremony parking is only on Chambers Way
- Chapel reservations do not apply to any other part of the Rock Ledge Ranch Historic Site including the parking lot.
- Under no circumstances may a motor vehicle park next to the Chapel or inside the Park fence line
- There is a heater/air conditioner unit in the chapel for ceremony use.
- The Chapel is in a natural area. Do not release birds, butterflies, throw rice or confetti.
- Flowers or other decorations should not be delivered early or left after use
- No restrooms or changing areas

Maximum Capacity: 15 capacity; seats 12 in chapel

Cost: \$200

Horticultural Art Society Heritage Garden Gazebo

1117 Glen Avenue (Southeast of I-25 Exit 3143)

- No seating provided, can bring in chairs.
- Limited parking along Mesa Road (Glenn Avenue)
- No electricity, no restrooms, and no tables on site
- Picnics not permitted

Maximum Capacity: 10-35

Cost: \$75

Garden of the Gods

There is no charge for the designated Garden of the Gods areas. These sites are on a first come, first served basis. With no reservations/permits available. *Please respect the capacities listed.*

1. Jaycee Plaza (50 people)
2. Sentinel Plaza (25 people)
3. Three Graces Plaza (25 people)
4. Scotsman Picnic Area (25 people)
5. South Spring Canyon Area (50 people)

- Weddings are only allowed if they are small, brief ceremonies.
- Only provide chairs for the elderly or disabled. Do not bring in any tables, tents, arches, trellises, etc. Do not release birds, butterflies, throw rice or confetti. No decorations allowed.
- Blocking off areas, including parking, is not permitted.
- Please stay on established trails and do not disturb the tundra.
- Tourists and other groups may be at the same site. Please be respectful of other park users.
- No receptions are allowed in the park unless you are at the Scotsman or South Spring Canyon picnic areas.

Pavilion Reservation Fees

- Park Pavilions:
- \$75 small/day
 - \$125 large/day

Don't Delay... Reservations are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.

Payment is required at the time of booking. Master Card, Visa, Discover and American Express can be used online or by phone. In-person with check, cash, or credit card.

NOTE: Facility amenities require permit holder to provide own sports equipment. Having a permit does not give exclusive use to any amenity.

General Questions

Small groups, under 50 people, can use parks on a first come, first served basis. All groups over 50 and those wishing to guarantee exclusive use, can reserve one of our pavilions.

Reservation hours coincide with park hours with the exception of American Mother's Chapel.

Bounce houses are no longer available with a pavilion reservation. If you would like to have a bounce house in a park, please see the *Special Event - Park Only application*.

Please review all park rules listed on site or in this brochure. Those caught in violation could be ticketed and/or fined.

Pavilion Areas

ANTLERS PARK: \$75

31 West Pikes Peak Avenue; 80903
Maximum Capacity: 40 People; 40 under shelter
Facilities: Restrooms and electrical outlets available upon request during summer months



CHEYENNE CAÑON MESA: \$125

2130 South Cheyenne Cañon Road; 80906
(Road is marked with signage)
Maximum Capacity: 100 People; 72 under shelter
Facilities: Pavilion, electricity, hiking trails



MEMORIAL PARK (3 PAVILION SITES): \$75 EACH

1605 East Pikes Peak Avenue; 80910
(Near Hancock Avenue and Costilla Street)
Maximum Capacity: 50 People at each; 50 under shelter
Facilities: No electricity, restrooms available upon request during summer months
Additional Memorial Park amenities include playground, basketball, tennis, courts, jogging/walking trail around Prospect Lake



MONUMENT VALLEY PARK: \$125

170 West Cache La Poudre Street; 80903
Maximum Capacity: 200 People; 200 under shelter
Facilities: Electricity, restrooms available upon request during summer months
Additional Monument Valley amenities include playground, jogging/walking trail, basketball, sand volleyball, tennis courts



NANCY LEWIS PARK: \$75

2615 Logan Avenue; 80907
Maximum Capacity: 50 People; 14 under shelter
Facilities: Near pond with waterfall/fountain, restrooms available upon request year round



THORNDALE PARK: \$75

2310 West Uintah Street; 80904
Maximum Capacity: 50 People; 20 under shelter
Facilities: Basketball, tennis courts, playground, ballfield, multi-use area and restrooms available upon request during summer months



PALMER PARK (4 PAVILION SITES)

3650 Maizeland Road; 80909
Additional amenities vary per pavilion. Can include community playground, nearby jogging/walking/mountain biking trail, soccer/football fields, dog park, sand volleyball, baseball fields (reservation only), horse stable

COUNCIL GROUNDS: \$125

Maximum Capacity: 100 People; 84 under shelter
Facilities: No electricity, restrooms available upon request during summer months



LAZY LAND: \$125

Maximum Capacity: 100 People; 84 under shelter
Facilities: No electricity, horseshoe pit, sand volleyball



THE MEADOWS: \$75

Maximum Capacity: 50 People; 30 under shelter
Facilities: No electricity, restrooms available upon request during summer months



YOUTH CAMP: \$125

Maximum Capacity: 100 People; 84 under shelter
Facilities: No electricity, restrooms available upon request during summer months
